KAVALA



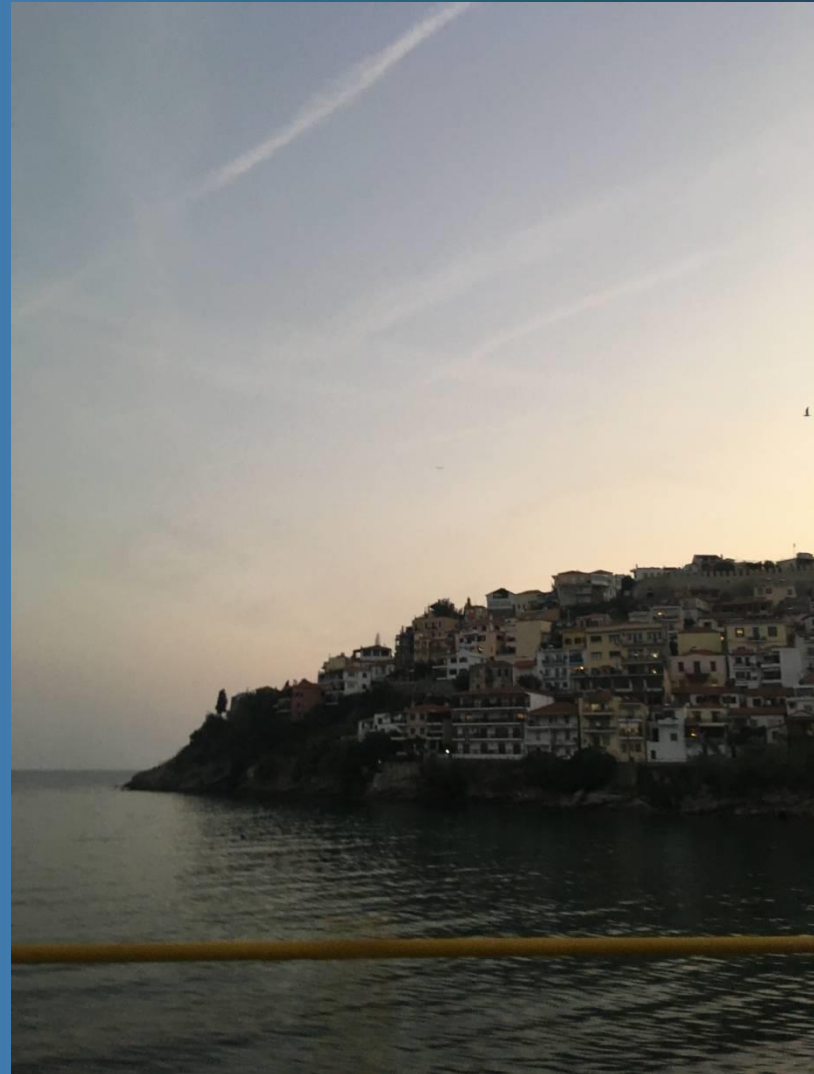
Kavala is one of the most beautiful cities in Macedonia. The permanent population of the city amounts to 54,027 inhabitants.

❖ Then it was renamed Christopolis (746 AD - 1470 AD)

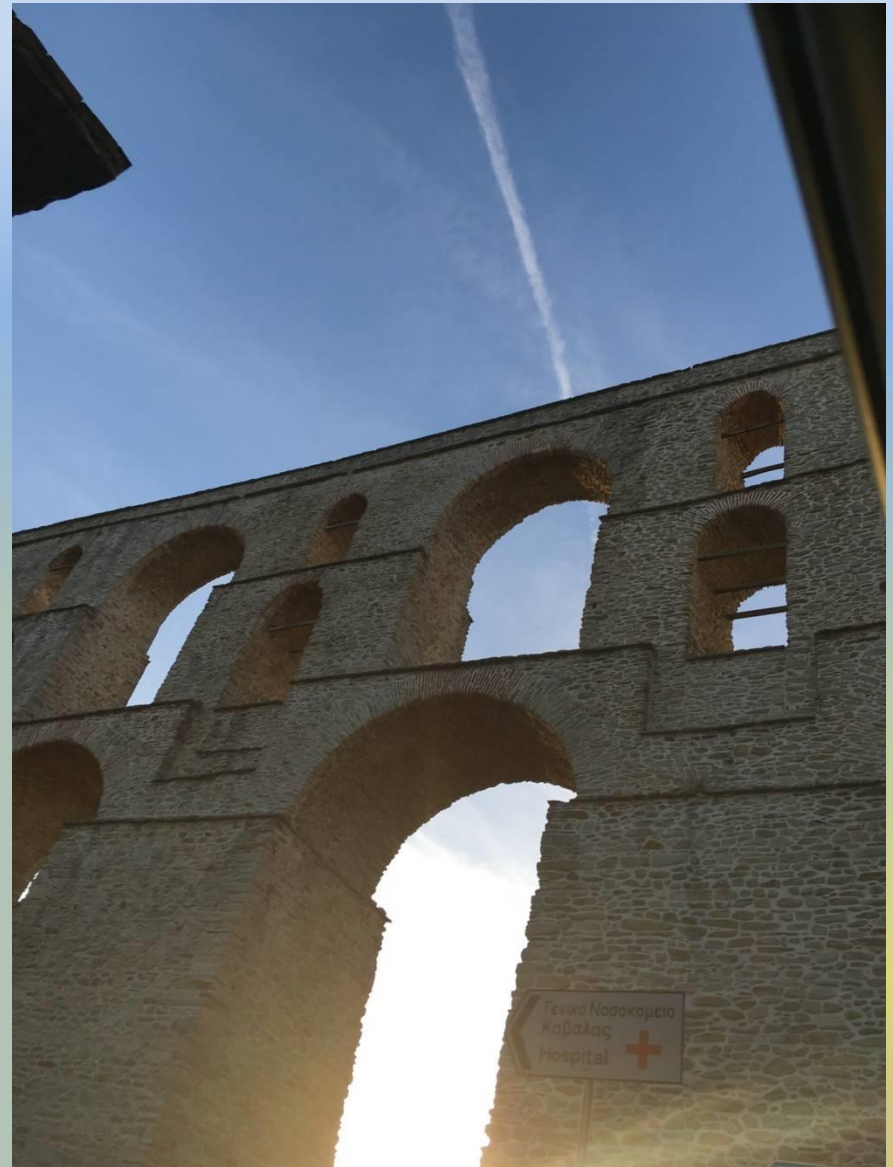
❖ In the end the name that prevailed is Kavala (1470 AD - today)

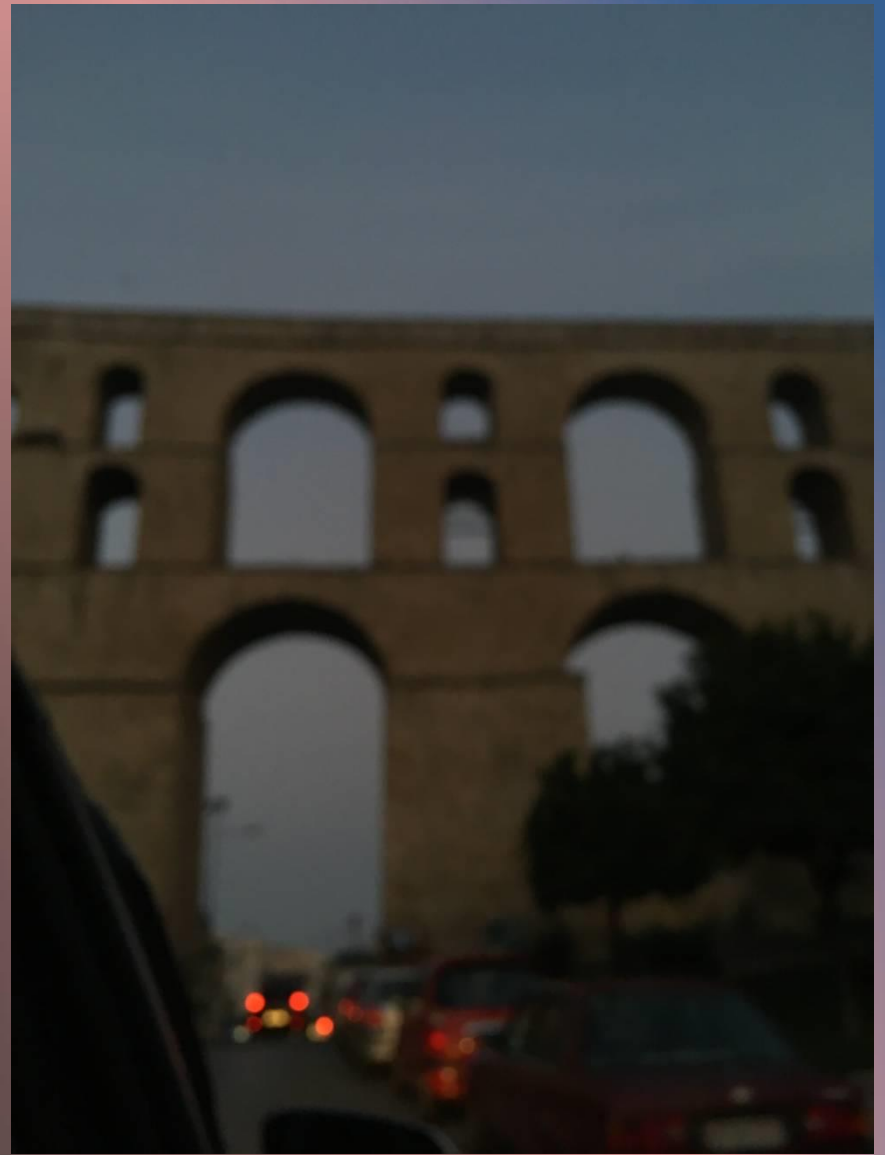




Kavala has numerous beaches and hiking trails. In addition, it consists of artificial forest as it is built on rocky ground.

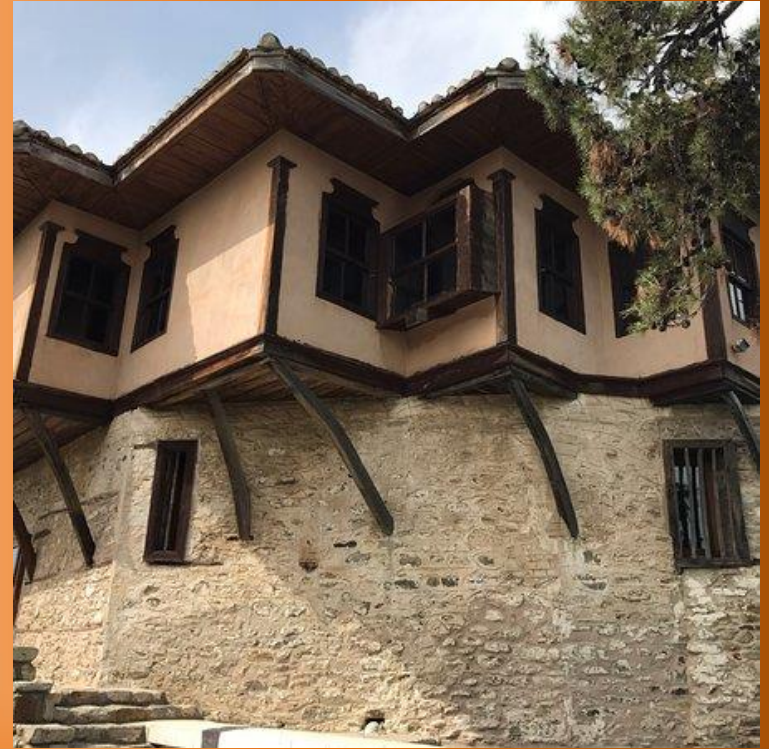
The Old Aqueduct, also known as Kamares, is one of the city's landmarks. The aqueduct dates back to the 16th century. Some writers dated the construction until 1522, but a more likely date is between 1530 and 1536. Until 1911, it was still used to supply the city with drinking water.





The smokeshops of Kavala is a very special sight of the city for every visitor. They are found in many areas of the city. These buildings are characteristic of a period of economic growth in Kavala, when at the beginning of the century the city grew rapidly due to tobacco products trade.





Mehmet Ali's house is a beautiful building that was built in 1720 and is still preserved in a very good condition. There the Egyptian pasha was born in 1769. Until a few years ago it operated as a museum with many interesting exhibits. Now it works as a coffee bar.
